



Rustlers are cutting old Mustangs out of the Atlanta herd.

During May, 18 Mustang automobiles were stolen. Most of them were the first models of the Ford Mustang series — from 1965 through 1968 — although some of them have been later models.

None has been recovered, a sign that professional thieves — rather than joyriders — are doctoring the cars and reselling them, according to auto theft detective R. T. Ford.

There is another sign that professionals may be responsible for the disappearing Mustangs. They have vanished in bunches from certain parts of the city.

Five have been stolen in the Houston Street-Piedmont Avenue-Downtown area. Three were taken in the Collier Road-Coronet Way-26th Street area. Two were from Stewart Avenue, and two were from Buck
