BY-LAWS AMENDED AS OF AUGUST 18, 1977

of the

MUSTANG CLUB OF AMERICA

ARTICLE I Purpose and Classification

Section 1. The general purpose of this club, incorporated as a nonprofit society, and hereinafter called the National Club, shall be to preserve and authentically maintain Mustang and Shelby motor cars of the years 1965 through 1973 inclusive, and to serve as an accurate and technical source of information concerning these automobiles for the benefit of its members as well as the general public.

Section 2. In order to facilitate the general purposes, automobiles shall be classified as follows:

- A. Mustang. This classification shall include any vehicle utilizing a chassis manufactured by the Ford Motor Company during the era from 1965 until 1973, and incorporating a body which was of unique design, outstanding features, or unusual factory custom styling.
- Section 3. Regional Groups are authorized to allow members in good standing with the National Club to hold office, vote, and tour in the local club as they so deem.

Section 4. The word; AUTHENTIC, will be defined for purposes of clarification as being the proper description of a genuine standard production vehicle in that it must be of the same chassis, body, upholstery, color, engine year and parts as that which the Ford Motor Company offered in that particular year of the vehicle's production.

ARTICLE II Corporate Seal and Official Emblem

- Section 1. The Corporation shall have a common seal consisting of a circle having within its circumference the words; "Mustang Club of America, Incorporated Georgia".
- Section 2. The official emblem of the National Club shall consist of a circle with a facsimile of the Mustang emblem centered therein, with "The Mustang Club of America" inscribed just inside the circumference in lettering of a particular style as previously adopted by the National Board of Directors.
 - A. The official club emblem may be used and displayed by any member in good standing of the National Club.
 - B. Regional Groups are authorized to use the official club emblem in unaltered form on projects or products for the promotion or development of the regional or National Club provided permission is first obtained from the National Board of Directors through duly presented plans or drawings of the proposed project.
 - C. The official club emblem is the property of the National Club.

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ARTICLE III Executive Offices

Section 1. The Executive Office for the National Club is hereby fixed and located in the County of DeKalb, State of Georgia.

ARTICLE IV Personal Liability

Section 1. Neither the members of the Corporation, the Board of Directors nor Officers, present or future, shall be held personally liable for any claim, damage, or debt against the Corporation or its members.

Section 2. No member of this nonprofit corporation shall have the right to individual proceeds of the club assets or property.

ARTICLE V Officers and Parliamentarian

Section 1. Type of officers; the officers of this club shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Officers shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected. The Parliamentarian shall be appointed by the President.

- A. Nominees for the offices of President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer must be Active Members in good standing.
- B. Officers will be elected by the Board with which they will serve.

Section 2. Removal and resignation: Any officer may be removed for cause by a three-fourths (3/4) majority vote of the Directors at the time in office, at a regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors, and in the case of committee men chosen by the Board of Directors, by any officer upon whom such power of removal may be conferred by the Board of Directors, or by the Board of Directors. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Board of Directors or to the President or Secretary of the Corporation. Any such resignation shall take effect on the date of receipt of such notice or at any later time specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

Section 3. Vacancies: A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause, shall be filled in the manner prescribed in the By-Laws for regular election or appointment to such office.

Section 4. All immediate past National Presidents shall become regular members of the National Board of Directors for a term of three (3) years. Said directorship shall commence on January 1st or after the election of a new President, and end three years later on December 31st.

Section 5. All Officers shall have the right to vote with the assembly and to debate questions the same as any other member.

ARTICLE VI Duties of Officers and Parliamentarian

Section 1. PRESIDENT - The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation and shall, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, have general supervision, direction and control of the business and affairs of the Corporation. He shall preside at all meetings of the members and at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The President shall sign all contracts and other instruments in writing, provided, however, that all contracts and instruments in writing must first be approved by the Board of Directors. The President shall appoint the Parliamentarian.

Section 2. VICE PRESIDENT - The Vice President shall perform all the duties of the President in his absence, and when so acting shall have all the powers and restrictions of the President as set forth in Section 1. The Vice President shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be prescribed by the Board of Directors, and shall attend all their meetings.

Section 3. SECRETARY - The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the members and Board of Directors, record the minutes of all meetings, keep or cause to be kept, a current register of members, give notice of all meetings of members, and keep the Seal of the Corporation in safe custody. He shall have control of valuable papers and books of the club and shall be at all times subject to the control of the Board of Directors. The Secretary will certify and file amendments and revisions to the By-laws with the official copy as kept in the principal office. In the absence of the Secretary from any meeting of the members or Board of Directors, the presiding officer shall appoint a Secretary pro-tempore.

- A. Minutes of the meeting of the National Board of Directors will be compiled and duplicated by the Secretary following each meeting and copies distributed to all National Board Members, Parliamentarian, regional groups, and Historian, and such other individuals as the President or Board of Directors may designate.
- B. The Secretary shall compile copies of the minutes of all previous meetings filed in such a way as to be available for reference during meetings and at other times.

Section 4. TREASURER - The Treasurer shall keep a correct accounting of the Club's business transactions. He shall deposit all monies and other assets in Corporation depository as may be designated by the Board of Directors. He shall disburse the funds of the Corporation as may be ordered by the Board of Directors, and shall render to the President and Board of Directors an accounting of the Corporation's assets and liabilities when they request such information. No obligation, debt, or other liabilities shall be incurred by the Treasurer without specific approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 5. PARLIAMENTARIAN - The Parliamentarian will be present at all meetings of the Board of Directors or of the members. He will advise in all areas of parliamentary law and contribute toward the proper order of business:

A. The Parliamentarian will have available for reference at each meeting copies of the proper parliamentary authority, the Articles of Incorporation, current By-Laws, and such other documents and information as is necessary to carry out the proper order of business.

ARTICLE VII Membership

- Section 1. There shall be (3) classes of members of this club as follows:
 - A. ACTIVE MEMBER Any person interested in promoting the purpose of this club. Active members are entitled to all club privileges, including the right to vote with the assembly.
 - B. LIFE MEMBER All National Past Presidents shall automatically become Life Members upon completion of their term of office.
 - C. CHARTER MEMBER A person who became affiliated with this club's predecessor on or before January, 1977.
- Section 2. APPLICATION: Application for National Club membership shall be in writing, filed with the Secretary, and accompanied by dues for the current year.
- Section 3. RESIGNATION: Any member may resign upon notification to the Secretary and such resignation shall be effective upon receipt by said Secretary provided his indebtedness to the National Club, if any, paid in full.
- Section 4. SUSPENSION, EXPULSION, REINSTATEMENT BY THE TREASURER: Any member may be suspended by the Treasurer for non-payment of dues after anniversary date. Suspension by the Treasurer shall be at the discretion of the Treasurer. Upon payment of back dues, a member suspended for non-payment shall be automatically reinstated providing he pays any additional dues that have accumulated during the suspension period together with the delinquent amount that caused the suspension.
- Section 5. SUSPENSION, EXPULSION, REINSTATEMENT BY BOARD OF DIRECTORS: The Board of Directors shall have summary power by vote of a majority of its members, to suspend or to expel and terminate the membership of any member for conduct which in its opinion disturbs the order, dignity, business or harmony, or impairs the good name, popularity, good will or prosperity of the organization, or which is likely to endanger the welfare, interest, or character of the organization, or for non-payment of dues, or for any conduct in violation of these By-Laws or of the rules and regulations of the Club which may be taken at any meeting of such board. The proceedings of the Board of Directors in such matters shall be final and conclusive. After the expiration of the time set forth in any suspension by the Board of Directors, the suspended member may petition the Board of Directors for reinstatement. A three/fourths affirmative vote of all members of the Board of Directors present at any regularly called meeting shall be required to pass upon such reinstatement. Life members may be suspended, expelled or reinstated, in the same manner as other members.

Section 6. GENERAL: Upon the resignation, suspension, expulsion, or the death of a member his rights and privileges as a member of this club shall cease.

ARTICLE VIII Meetings of the Members

Section 1. ANNUAL MEETING: The annual meeting of the members of this Corporation shall be held in the State of Georgia during the 3rd or 4th Friday, Saturday, or Sunday in January, for the purpose of reporting the results of the election of the Board of Directors by the Active Members, and the results of the election of Officers by the Directors of the Club.

- A. For purposes of clarification: The Board of Directors may elect to hold an annual Installation Dinner during the 3rd or 4th Friday, Saturday, or Sunday in January in lieu of a membership participation meeting.
- Section 2. SPECIAL MEETING: A Special meeting of the members may be called at any time by the President, or by the Secretary upon written application of at least one hundred Active Members in good standing. The application shall state the purpose of the meeting. The Secretary must send notices of special meetings as provided in Section 4 of Article VIII within thirty (30) days after receipt of a valid and proper application for same.
- Section 3. TIME AND PLACE: Any annual or special meeting shall be held at such time and place and date as the Board of Directors shall select. The Board of Directors shall select a time, place and date for a special meeting within thirty (30) days after receipt of a valid and proper application for same by the Secretary.
- Section 4. NOTICE: A written or printed notice stating the purpose, place, date and hour of every meeting shall be mailed by the Secretary to each Active Member in good standing at least ten (10) days prior but not more than (30) thirty days prior, to said meeting. If a member gives no address, notice shall be deemed to have been given him or her if sent by mail or other means of communication addressed to the member's last address.
- Section 5. QUORUM: At all meetings of the club 25 voting members in good standing shall constitute a quorum entitled to conduct legal business of the assembly.
- Section 6: PROCEDURE: Each voting member in good standing shall be entitled to one vote at any meeting, annual or special. The use of proxies at any membership meeting or Board of Directors meeting of this club will be allowed, and the proxy authorization must be in writing and signed by the absent member. A proxy shall not be considered to represent a member present at the meeting for the purpose of constituting a quorum.

Section 7. CUMULATIVE VOTING: Cumulative voting shall be prohibited.

ARTICLE IX Corporate Powers

Section 1. The Corporate Powers of this club shall be vested in a Board of ten (10) Directors, who shall be Active voting members in good standing. Five (5) Directors and or Officers constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

ARTICLE X Board of Directors

Section 1. ELECTION OF THE TERM: The Board of Directors of the National Club shall consist of ten (10) members elected from the active members in good standing. Six (6) members shall be elected from the state in which the National Club was incorporated, and four (4) members shall be elected as "out of state" Directors. No member shall be nominated until a seat has been declared vacant. The term of office shall be two (2) years from and after election or until a successor shall have been elected.

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Section 2. VACANCIES: A vacancy shall be deemed to exist in the case of the death, resignation, or removal of any Director, or if the authorized number of Directors be increased by amendment of these By-Laws and the Articles of Incorporation. A vacancy or vacancies shall be filled by the remaining Directors, by the members at an annual or special meeting of the Active members entitled to vote. Such member or members so elected shall hold office for the term of the Director he replaces, and until his successor is qualified and elected.

Section 3. No reduction of the authorized number of Directors shall have the effect of removing any Director prior to the expiration of his term of office.

Section 4. NOMINATING COMMITTEE: The nominating committee shall be appointed by the President from the Board of Directors, and shall prepare a ballot to have not less than five (5) names from the Active membership. The nominating committee will certify the qualifications of the prospective candidate before placing his name on the ballot. Active members shall elect by a plurality vote each year by blanket ballot, the necessary number of Directors to serve for two (2) years. Ballots must have the specified number of names selected or they will not be considered valid and will not be counted.

The nominating committee shall prepare a brief statement describing each nominee by name, city of residence and a statement of qualifications including offices held, past or present in the National Club or in any Regional group.

The nominating committee shall on December 1st, mail each Active member in good standing, according to National Headquarters (as of November 1st of each year), an envelope containing a ballot, a statement describing each nominee, a return envelope addressed to a certified public accountant (as selected by the Board of Directors) a plain envelope which shall contain the return ballot, and voting instructions which shall include a notice that all ballots must be received by the certified public accountant for tabulation, not later than December 31st. All ballots mailed to Active members outside the continental boundaries of the United States shall be posted by air mail.

A. In lieu of a certified public accountant the Board of Directors may elect to appoint a committee of not less than three (3) members in good standing to receive, open, and tabulate ballots as they are returned.

Section 5. PLACE OF MEETING: Regular meetings of the Board of Directors, shall be held at any place within the State of Georgia which has been designated from time to time by consent of a majority of the Board.

Section 6. REGULAR MEETING: The Board of Directors shall hold at least six (6) regular meetings during each fiscal year.

Section 7. SPECIAL MEETINGS: Special meetings of the Board of Directors for any purpose may be called at any time by the President or by any three (3) Directors, on notice of each Director of such a meeting.

Section 8. NOTICE: Written notice of the time and place of regular and special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be delivered personally or sent to each Director by mail or other form of written communication, charges prepaid, addressed to him at his address as it is shown upon the record of the National Club. Notices must be given, telegraphed or mailed at least ten (10) days prior to and not more than thirty (30) days prior to any meeting.

Section 9. QUORUM: Four (4) members of the Board of Directors and or Officers shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, except to adjourn as hereinafter provided.

Section 10. ADJOURNMENT: A quorum of the Directors or Officers may adjourn any Director's meeting to meet again at a stated time, place, and hour, provided however, that in the absence of a quorum, the Directors present at any Directors' meeting, either regular or special, may adjourn from time to time until the time fixed for the next regular meeting of the Board.

SECTION 11. ATTENDANCE: Directors shall notify the President as soon as practicable if unable to attend a Directors' meeting.

SECTION 12. FEES AND COMPENSATION: Directors shall not receive any compensation, fee or salary for their services as Directors, but by resolution of the Board, compensation may be allowed to any Director for any monies or expenses actually incurred and paid by any Director for the benefit of the Corporation.

ARTICLE XI Powers of Directors

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall have power to call meetings of the National Club when it deems it necessary to conduct, manage and control the affairs, relations and business of the club, and to make rules not inconsistent with the laws of the State of Georgia, for guidance and management of the affairs of the club. The Board of Directors shall have power to incur indebtedness, the terms and amount of which shall be entered in the minutes of the Board, and the note or obligation, if any, given for the same, signed officially by the President and the Secretary, shall be binding on the club. The Board of Directors may appoint other agents or committees as it deems necessary and shall fill all temporary or permanent vacancies that may occur during the year in any National Club office.

ARTICLE XII Parliamentary Authority

Section 1. The rules contained in the current edition of "Roberts Rules of Order" shall govern the club in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these By-Laws and any special rules of order the National Club may adopt.

ARTICLE XIII Certificate of Membership

Section 1. Certificates of membership shall be of such form and device as the Board of Directors may from time to time elect.

ARTICLE XIV Contracts

Section 1. The Board of Directors, except as the By-Laws or Articles of Incorporation otherwise provide, may authorize any Officer or Officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or special, and unless so authorized by the Board of Directors, no Officer, agent or employee shall have any person or authority to bind the Corporation by any contract or agreement or to any amount.

ARTICLE XV Inspection of By-Laws

Section 1. The Corporation shall keep in its principal office the original (or a copy of) the By-Laws as amended or otherwise altered, to date, certified by the Secretary which shall be open to inspection by the members at all reasonable times.

Revenues

Section 1. DUES: Membership dues shall be such as shall be fixed by the Directors from time to time.

Section 2. WHEN DUE - WHEN DELINQUENT: Dues shall be payable at the end of 12-month membership anniversary, and are delinquent thereafter.

ARTICLE XVII Amendments

Section 1. BY MEMBERS: New By-Laws may be adopted or these By-Laws may be amended or repealed by a two-thirds majority vote of the Active voting members, either present or represented by proxy at an annual or special meeting where a quorum be present.

Section 2. BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS: The Board of Directors may adopt, amend, or repeal By-Laws. To become effective a proposed amendment or change must receive a majority vote of the Directors present at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors and a two-thirds majority vote of the Directors present or by proxy, at the next regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. RESTRICTIONS: Not less than six (6) months must elapse between a meeting defeating a proposed amendment or repeal, and a new presentation of the same or substantially the same, amendment or repeal.

MUSTANG CLUB OF AMERICA

REGIONAL GROUPS

A. Formation

- Section 1. The Board of Directors of the Mustang Club of America (hereinafter called the National Club) may determine the territorial limits of each chartered regional group.
- Section 2. Granting of a Charter will be considered for each prospective club meeting all requirements and obligations; provided, however, that by the constitution and By-Laws of the National Club now in force, or hereafter from time to time adopted.
- Section 3. A chartered club shall use only the name designated in its charter. The new regional group name shall be the same as the area in which the headquarters are to be located after the regional group charter is granted. The NAME of the NEW GROUP shall be: "The (area) Regional Group of the Mustang Club of America".
- Section 4. Membership in good standing in the National Club shall be a pre-requisite to membership in a regional group.
- Section 5. The charter membership of a regional group shall not be less than five (5) active members of the National Club.
- Section 6. Application for formation of a regional group shall be made to the Board of Directors of the National Club in the form of a petition which shall be duly signed by at least five (5) persons who are active members of the National Club.
- Section 7. After approval by the Board of Directors of the National Club, the said Board shall direct, through the Chairman of the regional group committee, the organizing of said regional group.
- Section 8. Any regional group that fails to conform to the provisions of the constitution and By-Laws of the National Club may have its charger and membership herein suspended or revoked by action of the Board of Directors of the National Club, and if charter is revoked, the regional group agrees to use the name "The Mustang Club of America" until charter is declared again in force by action of the Board of Directors of the National Club.
- Section 9. All regional groups are allowed a 50-mile radius, but may have members from outside that limit.

B. Incorporation

Section 1. A regional group, after receiving its charter, may incorporate subject to the approval of the Board of Directors of the National Club, and said regional group shall agree, as a pre-requisite to incorporation, that it will, as an incorporated body, abide by the constitution and By-Laws of the National Club then in force or thereafter from time to time adopted.

C. Board of Directors

Section 1. As soon after organization as possible, a meeting of all members of the regional group will be called and a Board of Directors elected by the membership. This Board of Directors shall consist of not less than five (5) members in good standing. A quorum of the Board of Directors shall consist of a majority of same.

Section 2. Immediately following the election of the members of the Board of Directors such Board shall meet and from its members elect regional group officers as provided in Section D of this Article.

D. Officers of Regional Groups

- Section 1. The officers of a regional group shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary and/or Treasurer.
- Section 2. The President shall preside over all meetings of the Board of irectors and meetings of the members. He shall sign all contracts and other instruments of writing which shall have been first approved by the Board of Directors.
- Section 3. In the absence of the President, or his inability to act, the Vice-President shall preside in his place.
- Section 4. The Secretary shall keep a full and complete record of the proceedings of the Board of Directors and meetings of the members; shall make service of such notices as may be necessary and proper; shall supervise and control the keeping of the books and accounts of the regional group; and shall discharge such other duties as pertaining to his office or as prescribed by the Board of Directors.
- Section 5. Treasurer shall receive and safely keep all funds of the regional group and deposit same in such bank as may be convenient. Such funds shall be paid out only on the check of the regional group signed by the treasurer.

E. Meetings

Section 1. A regional group shall hold a minimum of six (6) meetings of the Board of Directors during the fiscal year. It may hold such other meetings as the Board of Directors and membership may desire.

Section 2. The Secretary of each regional group shall, in January of each year, certify to the Secretary of the National Club, the names of the officers elected to serve in the ensuing year.

F. Revenues

- Section 1. The fiscal year for all regional groups shall begin on the first day of January of each year.
- Section 2. Dues for each member are assessed for the calendar year. Dues are payable January 1 of each year and are delinquent February 1. Only members in good standing can vote and only members in good standing can hold office.
- Section 3. Each year a list of all members, as of June 1 of that year, shall be mailed to the National Club so as to be received not later than July 1.





MUSTANG - THE 50 MILLION DOLLAR BABY

Experimental cars and dream designs are produced by the thousands each year with high hopes by the designers that eventually their Models would survive long enough to reach production. Only a selected few ever reach the production stage and of these that do even fewer ever make instant sales smashers. You can count those that did on about two fingers with the Mustang being one of them.

There was something unusual about the Mustang since it had basically the same running gears as the Falcon. It was a totally new body design however, which was coupled to all new concepts in automotive marketing. A youth oriented family sports car.

The Mustang concept originated from a tiny experimental car that could be driven on a kitchen table. This model was first exhibited at the U. S. Grand Prix at Watkins Glen, New York, in the fall of 1962.

The overall presentation was the result of a very young management team during 1961 which was headed by Lee A. Iacocca who served as Division General Manager at Ford. The mood of the Nation at that time was very youthful and buyers sought out items for buying which had sporty flair. A very good time to introduce the Mustang.

Why such an investment in a totally new car? Ford had suffered a shocking loss of sales because of the sheer lack of a sporty product. There was an increasing gap between the age of Ford and Chevy buyers and the resulting conclusion was that Ford was simply not attracting its share of the growing youth market——something had to be done.

Things were placed in motion quickly and by late 1961, a task force of engineers, planners, and designers, had put together some basic parameters for the car. It was decided that it could not exceed 180 inches in length, weigh more than 2,500 pounds, or cost more than \$2,500.00.

The basic project was speeded a bit by Gene Bordinat, Ford's designing chief, who staged design competition between the company's three design studios. They were given only two weeks to come up with actual clay models of what they felt the new car should look like.

When the models were completed, the winning entry was the one submitted by the chief stylist of Ford Division Studio, Joseph Oros. The production model looked very near the same as the clay model when it was presented first at the New York World's Fair.

According to the chief stylist, a list of do's and dont's were made before the actual work was begun. The car had to be unique and could not resemble any other car. Probably the most unparelleled feat in auto design history. The actual car remained essentially unchanged from the clay model.

With all the excitement at Ford, public introduction was set at April 19, 1964 - opening week at the World's Fair. The first production model came off the assembly line on March 9, 1964. The Ford people dubbed the car as being peculiar since everyone at Ford was so excited about it. The little Mustang baby received several awards for design excellence, some of the most notable from the famous New York jeweler, Tiffany & Co., and from the Industrial Designers Institute.

No car has ever before been so sucessful. Ford dealerships were swamped with visitors. Some dealers had to limit show room crowds by locking the doors at intervals. A Mustang was used as a pace car for a stock car race in Huntsville, Alabama and 9,000 fans jumped the wall to surround the car delaying the race for a hour. Within four months of introduction, more than 100,000 Mustangs had been sold and the car had reached the top five in auto sales volume. The first weekend of introduction more than 22,000 were ordered. Over 4 million people visited Ford showrooms that one weekend.

Ford spent more than 10 million in National Advertising to the public. No advertising media was omitted. The car was well received. The total spent from development to production exceeded 50 million dollars. It was a gamble that continues to pay off very big for Ford.

What caused the Mustang mania? Basically, the car was sharp looking - absolutely beautiful to be exact - and offered options that provided for performance, luxury, and economy. All of this was offered without costing near the price of comparable foreign sports cars. Several auto makers leaped on the mania band wagon with "sporties" of

their own. Of these were Javelin, Cougar, Charger, and other since these. None have come near the Mustang's sucess story. Even today, Mustang remains to be the right little baby for millions of people --Yes, Ford's 50 million dollar baby still is our pet.

Moreover, Mustang Clubs sprang up by the hundreds - weekends were filled with excitement as the hopped up 289 V8'S dominated their class at the drag strips. They were smashing performers, even ushered in a new type of racing called Can AM.

The time has almost dawned upon those of us who love the original ponies, thanks to Detroit, when either we must take drastic steps to preserve the original breed or, bump them into the category of the dying and neglected species and just allow it to become extinct. That's Detroit's definition of progress and they too have suffered for the mistake. Since they changed the baby, sales plumeted. What they considered progress was actually a regression and the sales figures will substantiate this.
